

To date, 12 African countries have abolished the death penalty for all crimes; 20 retain the death penalty but are no longer carrying out executions; and 21 retain and use the death penalty. The World Coalition against the death penalty has decided to devote the World Day 2005 to a campaign to encourage all African countries to abolish capital punishment permanently.




